A FILM UNFINISHED

Director: Yael Hersonski, Germany/Israel, 2009, 87 min., German/Hebrew/Polish/Yiddish w/ subtitles

At the end of WWII, 60 minutes of raw film was discovered in an East German archive, where it had been stored out of sight and undisturbed. Shot by the Nazis in Warsaw in May 1942, and labeled simply "Ghetto," this footage quickly became a resource



for historians seeking an authentic record of the Warsaw Ghetto. However, the later discovery of a long-missing reel complicated earlier readings of the footage.

A FILM UNFINISHED presents the raw footage in its entirety — carefully noting fictionalized sequences falsely showing "the good life" enjoyed by Jewish urbanites, including a staged dinner party — and probes deep into the making of a now-infamous Nazi propaganda film. A FILM UNFINISHED is a film of enormous import, documenting some of the worst horrors of our time and exposing the efforts of its perpetrators to propel their agenda and cast it in a favorable light.





Jewsweek. He currently works as an editor at the Mother Nature Network.





Hillel: If Not Now, When?

"What is hateful unto you, do not do unto your neighbor. That is the whole Torah, all the rest is commentary. Now, go and study."



This is the most famous teaching of Hillel, one of the greatest rabbis of the Talmudic era. What makes it so extraordinary is that

it was offered to a gentile seeking to convert. Rabbi Joseph Telushkin sees great relevance in this Talmudic story today, given how frequently religiosity is equated with ritual observance alone, how little most Jews worry about the future corps of Jewish teachers and how many Jews intermarry (more than 40%). Hillel's ancient openmindedness, Rabbi Telushkin believes, is just what today's Judaism needs. An acclaimed spiritual leader, scholar and author, Telushkin has written nine other nonfiction books, including *The Book of Jewish Values*, *The Golden Land: The Story of Jewish Immigration to America*, and *Jewish Literacy*, the most widely read book on Judaism of the past two decades.
